

# Cross-Sound Fast Ferry FACT SHEET

Kitsap Transit is proposing an added 0.3% local sales tax to support the cross-sound fast-ferry plan. Kitsap County voters will have the opportunity to vote on the funding for the plan on the November 8, 2016 ballot. Sales tax isn't collected on things like groceries, housing, heating, electricity, prescription drugs or health care. On average, an adult in Kitsap County would pay an additional \$59 a year.

#### WHY FAST FERRY? Convenience

- Get directly to downtown Seattle in about half the time.
- More frequent sailings from the Peninsula mean more choices for Kitsap travelers.
- Cheaper, in many cases, than current travel options.

#### **Local Control**

• Local funding means local control of service and fares.

#### **Community Benefits**

- Greater access to jobs, higher education, entertainment and health care options in Seattle.
- Shorter commutes mean more time for individuals to spend with their families and in the community.
- Transit investments, like the cross-sound ferry, help grow our economy and create opportunities for local businesses.



#### **PROJECTED RIDERSHIP**



## Kitsap's ferry plan: To Seattle, fast

Kitsap Transit proposes to launch a cross-sound fast-ferry service to Seattle from Bremerton, Kingston, and Southworth by 2020. Crossing times on the three routes would range from 23 minutes to 33 minutes. Currently the only place in Kitsap County with direct service to Seattle in approximately a half-hour is Bainbridge Island.


